CRIMINAL INFORMATION

The Second Judicial District Attorney of Bernalillo County, State of New Mexico, states that in Otero County, New Mexico, the above-named defendant did:

Count 1: FIRST DEGREE MURDER (WILLFUL AND DELIBERATE), SECOND DEGREE MURDER (FIREARM ENHANCEMENT) (0001)

That on or about June 25, 2024, in Otero County, New Mexico, the above-named defendant did kill Elijah Hadley, with the deliberate intention to take away the life of Elijah Hadley, contrary to Section 30-2-1(A)(1), NMSA 1978; AND FURTHERMORE, the defendant is hereby notified that upon trial of this case the finder of fact may be instructed to consider Murder in the Second Degree (Firearm Enhancement), contrary to Sections 30-2-1(B) and 31-18-16, NMSA 1978
